

Signal Bay Waterpark

Pool Rules

- Swimming is allowed only when a Manassas Park lifeguard is present.
- Facility is available for use to persons 12 and older. Those under 12 must be accompanied by a supervising adult age 16 or older.
- Children under age 5 must be accompanied by a supervising adult in proper swim attire within arm's reach in the pool
- All swimmers are required to take soap showers before entering the pool.
- The last break is called 15 minutes before park closing. There is no adult swim during the last break.
- Management reserves the right to prohibit access to any area of the waterpark to any customer as situations necessitate.
- Any person having a skin disease, nasal or ear discharge, inflamed eyes or any communicable disease (including diarrhea within the last 2 weeks) is not permitted to use the facility.
- Diaper changing is permitted only in the restrooms.
- Non-toilet trained children and incontinent adults must wear swim diapers. Swim diapers must be changed regularly.
- Water guns, inflatable toys or flotation devices are not permitted.
- No horseplay, dunking, pulling, 'piggy back' rides, or other dangerous acts. No extended breath holding games or competitions. Please do not drink pool water.
- Socializing with or distracting the lifeguards on duty is prohibited.
- No dives or flips from the side of the pool in any depth of water. All jumps are forward facing and feet first.
- No gum, tobacco, glass bottles, or alcohol is allowed in the facility. Food and drinks may only be consumed in designated areas.
- The use of profanity will not be tolerated.
- Patrons appearing to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be asked to leave the park.
- Only authorized staff is allowed in the chemical room, filter room, and pool office.
- In the event of an accident involving human discharge in the pool (fecal matter or vomit), the pool shall follow the CDC's guidelines for sanitation.
- Please be aware that the acoustics are poor in the pool area and it is necessary for lifeguards to raise their voice in order to correct the situation. Please do not interpret this as rude or disrespectful.
- The pool staff is not responsible for loss or damage to personal belongings. Staff will attempt to retain items left at the facility for one week, at which point it may be recycled, donated, or thrown away.
- Please watch your children at all times. Your child's safety is your responsibility.
- Persons using any of the Department's pools do so at their own sole risk, responsibility, and expense.

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- **Swim Attire Policy:** White t-shirts may be worn in the pool at the discretion of the lifeguard, providing they are clean and do not pose a safety hazard 2.) Swimwear must be colorfast, and of a low water absorbent, quick drying, lightweight material suitable for swimwear such as lycra, spandex, or nylon. 3.) Undergarments are not allowed to be worn with bathing suits. 4.) Bathing suits with adequate coverage are required. Brazilian and thong bottoms are not permitted.
- **Lifeguard Signals:** 1.) One short whistle blast is intended to get the attention of a patron. Please direct your attention to the lifeguard if you hear one short whistle blast. 2.) One long continuous whistle is a signal to clear the pool. Please direct your attention to the lifeguards for information concerning evacuation of the pool. 3.) Two short whistle blasts is a signal to get the attention of another lifeguard. 4.) Three short whistle blasts is a signal for an emergency. Please ensure that the other lifeguards are aware of the situation.

Lazy River:

- Children under 43" must be accompanied in the Lazy River by a chaperone (ages 16+) within arm's reach. Infants and toddlers are encouraged to share a tube with their chaperone.
- Only one person per tube and one tube per person unless under 43".
- You must remain in the tube at all times while in the lazy river.
- Only sitting or lying on tubes is allowed. No standing on tubes.
- Entrance to the river is by the front entrance to the park.
- Exit using any of the stairs around the river.
- Please do not sit or stand on tubes while on the deck.
- No life jackets are permitted in the Lazy River.

Crossing Activity:

- Children must be at least 43" tall to use the activity.
- Only one person at a time across the path; next person may go when the last person exits the pool.
- Once you fall off, you must swim to the exit.
- No running across pads; use ropes or crawl.

Activity Pool:

- Slides are for children under the age of 12.
- Children must ride the slides feet first.
- Only one person down a slide at a time.
- No toys or floats are permitted.
- No loose clothing, goggles, suits with metal clasps, loose jewelry, or lifejackets may be worn on the slides.
- US Coast Guard Approved floatation devices are permitted in the Activity pool only. Their use by non-swimmers requires direct supervision by a paying adult in a swim attire within arm's reach at all times.
